A Clubhouse for St Matthews Farm and Council Elections

Those new to the club will not be aware that we have been trying for over four years now to get a clubhouse facility to replace the decrepit, run-down facility that we presently have. For a club the size of ours with 1500 players with 136 teams and not have a club house is a disgrace.

In a recent article in the Manly Daily I commented on how you can drive over the Narrabeen Bridge into Pittwater and see great sport facilities but what do we have in Warringah. Questions must be asked where do our rates go, what are they spent on? The same questions can be asked where your registration fees go. In your registration fees they are taken up by a Cromer Park Levy, Sporting Union Levy, a Levy to support Representative players in the area and of course insurance which is a big part of registration costs. What we as a club have left is not a great deal for admin, football equipment and shirts and socks. So back to the club house we at Strikers have been running a 6-a-side competition at the end of the season to raise funds to build a club house, this we have been doing for about eight years now.

One stumbling block to building a club house was that a Council Plan of Management (POM) that covered the Dee Why Basin area had to be rewritten as no development as far as a facility like what we are proposing could be built with the old POM. What we are proposing is not a Taj Mahal, it is simply a facility where toilets and showers work, some decent storage rooms, a canteen, two changing rooms, and most of all a meeting room which if you saw the box room that we presently hold meetings in a Plateau Park you would wonder how we run a club this size. It must also be remembered this will be a shared facility with both Cricket and Baseball. Add those sports and we get up to 2000 players and families of those players paying rates in the area. Show me an area in Sydney with that many players that does not have a club house. I guarantee there would not be one.

So where are we up to - well the POM was finally passed in June this year after taking over two years to complete. We can finally submit plans of what we are proposing. In the Plan of Management \$400,000 was the Council's figure

to build a club house facility on the present site of the 1960s building. We know that we have to do all the leg work to get a facility and boy has a lot of that been done so far and still needs to be done even though in the POM it says \$400,000 needs to be allocated. We could be waiting another four years the way Warringah Council moves. but with local elections coming up in September here is a chance to voice ourselves and see who will support local community groups such as ours to get what we deserve and should have.

As I said, we are pushing forward and we need your support, if you have the contacts for materials for the building of a club house it means we have to put less funds in from the club. We envisage without support to build a club house it would be \$500,000 but if we can get materials donated then that figure reduces. We need materials from the ground up - to list a few that includes concrete, roofing and in between timber, doors, electrical, lighting, plasterboard, tiling, cupboards, security system, floor coverings, roofing, paint, windows, water tank, toilets and sinks. Surely in a club our size we have people who have contacts to get some of these items.

The first thing we need is draughtsman for drawing up plans for the new club house. Our intention is to have a Licensed Builder build this facility so if you can contribute in any way whatsoever that would be great.

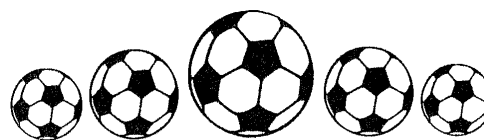

Plateau Park Main Field Closure

From July 21st until the end of the football season all games scheduled to be played on the main field at Plateau Park will now be played at Nolans Reserve.

This is due to works being carried out on the main field by a pipe drilling company which has a contract to put a submarine cable out to sea. Yes, unbelievable as it may sound Plateau Park was chosen as the spot to bore the hole to sink the cable. This work is expected to take three (3) months or more so our best option was to relocate the games from the main field to Nolans Reserve. Games allocated to the ¾ field will not be affected. The pipe drilling area will be fenced off completely.

If your team trains at Plateau Park all we can ask is common sense prevails and everyone works together to get a equal area to train. We apologise for this disruption but it was out of the clubs control.



Do You Know The Rules?

LAW 4 - PLAYERS' EQUIPMENT

This Law states that:

- Nothing dangerous is to be worn.
- No jewellery is to be worn.

These directions are also restated in the 'Additional Instructions to Referees' section of the Law Book. These two statements are related, but not dependent upon each other.

The Law is quite specific, however, about no jewellery being worn.

Earrings:

- No form of earrings or studs are acceptable.
- The practice of taping earrings/studs or piercings is unacceptable.

Facial Rings/Piercings:

- Any kind of jewellery around the eyes must be removed.
- Jewellery in any other part of the face must also be removed.
- The practice of taping facial rings or piercings is unacceptable.

Necklaces:

- All necklaces including metal, rope, fabric, or such other material must be removed.
- Medical alert necklaces only may be worn but they must be taped securely to the chest.

Bracelets:

- All bracelets including metal, rope, fabric, or other such material must be removed.
- Medical alert bracelets only may be worn but must be taped securely to the wrist.

Body Piercing:

Any piercing not visible to the referee is not of concern. Should the piercing become visible then the referee will require that the player remove it before being permitted to enter or re enter the field of play.

Rings:

- All rings must be removed.
- This includes flat wedding rings.
- Taping or otherwise covering rings will not be permitted under any circumstances.

Beaded Hair:

- If a player is wearing hair beads the hair must be tied in a bun or covered by a hair net.
- Loose beaded hair will not be permitted.

Hair Clips:

- Any hard rigid hair anchor e.g. metal or plastic hair clips, bobby pins, headbands, etc are not permitted. The use of fabric or elastic type hair restraints will be permitted providing they do not constitute a danger to either the player or an opponent.

What's In A Name

Under 7 Chipperfields - Scott Chipperfield

Scott Chipperfield is an Australian football (soccer) left midfielder, who currently plays for FC Basel in the Swiss Super League. He has dual Australian-Swiss citizenship.

A late bloomer, the former Wollongong bus driver rose to national prominence with his home club Wollongong Wolves, who he helped win two national titles. After winning his second Australian player of the year award in 2001 he moved to Switzerland, where he continued his club success assisting Basel to three championships and two cup final victories in his five seasons at the club. A natural left-sided player, his main asset is his pace and an ability to take on and regularly beat defenders. He has been a regular in the national team since 1998.

He joined Basel from the Wollongong Wolves in 2001 having had an unsuccessful trial with English side Bolton Wanderers the previous Winter.

He has twice won the Johnny Warren Medal for most outstanding player in the Australian Domestic Season.

At the 2006 FIFA World Cup he played an integral role in the Australian midfield and defence, and was considered one of Australia's best players at the tournament. Soon afterwards he was subject to a bid by Charlton Athletic but in July 2006 FC Basel announced he had signed a three-year contract extension, keeping him at the club until June 2009.

Chipperfield was selected to represent Australia at the 2006 FIFA World Cup in Germany, and was part of the team that successfully defeated Uruguay in a playoff in November 2005 to qualify for the FIFA World Cup in Germany.

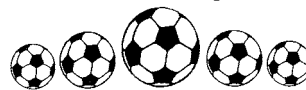
