## Strikers Cup Team Win Killarney Gala Day

The 2009 Under 9s Strikers Cup squad have returned from the Killarney Under 10s Gala Day with a win in their Division.

Playing in Division B of the competition against Under 10 Division 1 and 2 teams from the Central Coast the boys quickly got used to playing 11-a-side football with a 1-0 win over Budgewoi followed by a 3-0 win over Killarney District C, goals in these games coming from Harry Vander-sag, Deigo Cuadros-Garrot and two from Jesper Nicholson.

A middle of the day slump saw the boys lose by a single goal to Kincumber B and record a goal-less draw with Sthn & Ettalong United.

Going into the fifth game the Strikers boys went a goal down to Ourimbah United before bouncing back with goals from Jesper, Rhys Vorillas and Brodie Strachan.

Approaching the final game, Strikers needed a win against third placed Terrigal United to over-take Kincumber and win their division.

Going a goal behind after a spell of Terrigal United pressure, a succession of saves from goalkeeper Sam Benton kept Strikers in the game. Second half goals from Jesper and Rhys and a penalty from Harry (converted with the final kick of the game), saw the young Strikers win the game and the day.

In addition to goalscorers and keeper, the team benefited from creative midfield play from Tal Weiner and Isaiah Vumbaca, and the resolute defence of Jayden Lagana, Will Martin, Jacob Seeto and captain Ryan Martinuzzo.

### Visit Your GP Before Proceeding With Insurance Claim

CC Strikers would like to remind all managers and coaches that if a player wishes to proceed with any football insurance claim they MUST FIRST OBTAIN A MEDICAL REFERRAL from their GP before commencing any Non-Medicare treatment (physio, chiropractic, etc).

Also, they need to be aware that Federal Legislation currently prevents any insurance company from offering cover for Medicare items and the Medicare Gap.

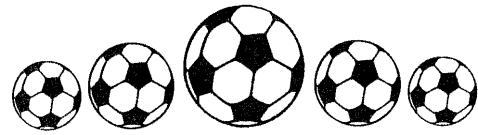

### ID Check - Reminder

All teams are reminded that the 2008 procedure of ID checking must be undertaken at every game. A full copy of the procedure has been circulated previously but may be viewed at the CC Strikers or MWFA websites. TEAMS WHO ARE REPORTED AS NON-COMPLIANT WILL INCUR A PENALTY OF ONE MATCH POINT. Please ensure you are ready to undertake the ID check at the time marked on your draw. Games to commence on completion of the check at 8.30am, 10.00am and 11.30am for the Junior morning games and as soon as possible for Senior games at 1.00pm and 3.00pm.

### Referees Cards and Results

All competition teams are reminded to check that ALL SECTIONS on referees cards are completed in full. Please do not staple or sticky tape labels to cards. Fines may be issued to teams with incomplete or incorrect information on cards. When phoning through results, please advise whether or not an official black & white referee was in attendance. ### Do You Know The Rules?

#### LAW 10 – The offside rule

##### Offside Position

It is not an offence in itself to be in an offside position.

A player is in an offside position if:

the player is nearer to his/her opponents' goal line than both the ball and the second last opponent.

A player is not in an offside position if:

- he/she is in his/her own half of the field of play or
- he/she is level with the second last opponent or he/she is level with the last two opponents.

##### Offence

A player in an offside position is only penalised if, at the moment the ball touches or is played by one of his/her team, he/she is, in the opinion of the referee, involved in active play by:

- interfering with play or
- interfering with an opponent or gaining an advantage by being in that position.

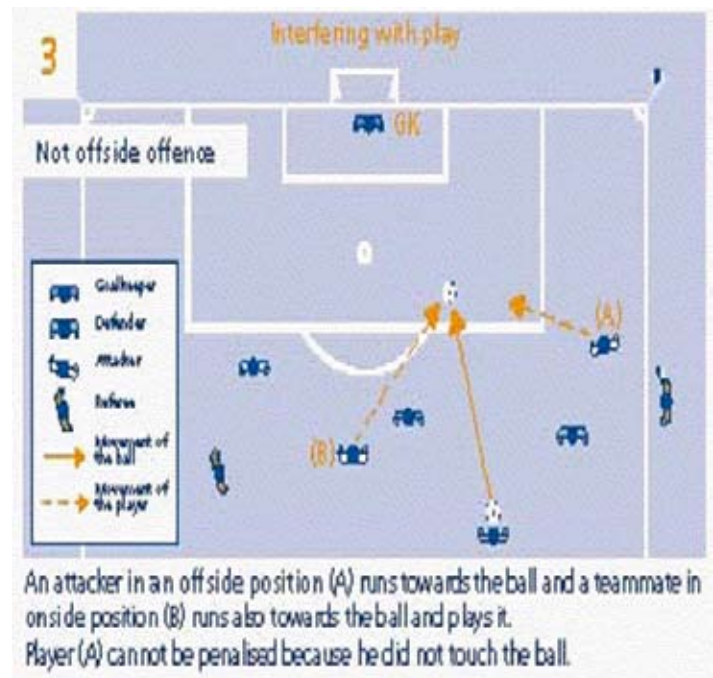
##### No Offence

There is no offside offence if a player receives the ball directly from:

- a goal kick or
- a throw-in or
- a corner kick

##### Infringement./Sanctions

For any offside offence, the referee awards an indirect free kick to the opposing team to be taken from the place where the infringement occurred.

## What's In A Name

### Under 8 Peles - Pele

Edison Arantes do Nascimento, (born October 23, 1940 in Três Corações, Brazil), is best known by his nickname Pelé. He is rated by many as the greatest footballer of all time. He was given the title of Athlete of the Century by the International Olympic Committee.

In his native Brazil, Pelé is hailed as a national hero. He is known for his accomplishments and contributions to the game of football, in addition to being officially declared the football ambassador of the world by FIFA and a national treasure by the Brazilian government. He is also acknowledged for his vocal support of policies to improve the social conditions of the poor (when he scored his 1,000th goal he dedicated it to the poor children of Brazil). During his career, he became known as "The King of Football", "The King Pelé" or simply "The King". He is also a member of the American National Soccer Hall of Fame.

Spotted by football star Waldemar de Brito, Pelé began playing for Santos Futebol Clube at 15 and his national team at 16, and won his first World Cup at 17. Despite numerous offers from European clubs, the current economic conditions and Brazilian Football regulations benefited Santos FC, thus enabling them to keep Pelé for almost two decades until his semi-retirement in 1974. Pelé played as an inside forward, striker, and what later became known as the playmaker position. Pelé's technique and natural athleticism have been universally praised; he was renowned for his excellent dribbling and passing, his paced, powerful shot, exceptional heading ability, and prolific goalscoring.

He is the all-time top scorer in the history of the Brazil national football team and is the only footballer to be a part of three World Cup-winning teams. It should be noted that though he was named part of the 1962 squad, he was injured and did not receive a winner's medal. In November 2007 FIFA announced that he would however be awarded the 1962 medal, making him the only player in the world to have three World Cup gold medals.

Since his full retirement in 1977 Pelé has been an ambassador for football and has also undertaken various acting roles and commercial ventures.
